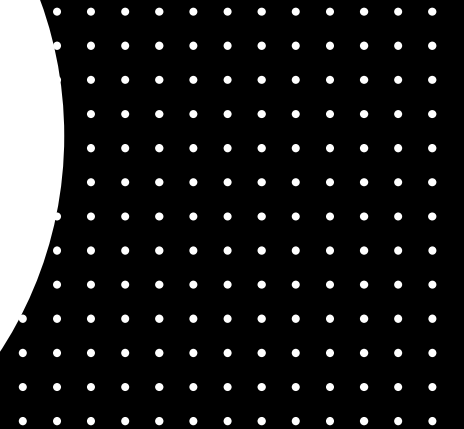
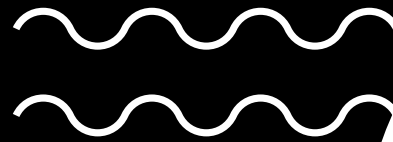


# Morocco

Morocco celebrates harvest in October.

The farmers of Erfoud have been transformed in recent years.

A festival is usually held on the third week of October. The harvest has celebrations with singing and dancing!





## What do Māori do to celebrate Harvest?



- At the start of the festival the Haka is performed by a group of men to welcome the people that are visiting for the celebration.
- Then they eat forest kai horotai which means summer seasons canapes. And a shared celebration of stories with pastimes and connection within the Tawa forest.
- The Kapa Haka is performed that is a bit like the haka in, but they dance a bit different than the one they perform at rugby matches.
- Then they have a three-course meal.

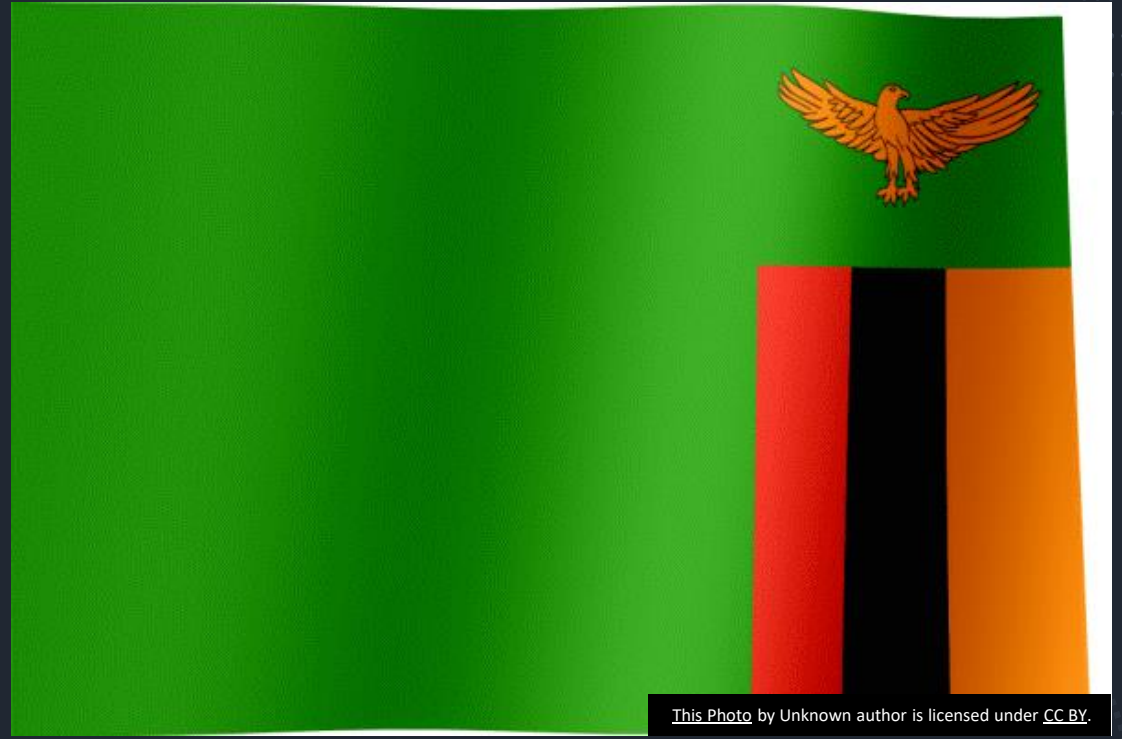




## Australia

- *A famous festival is the Maslenitsa Festival.*





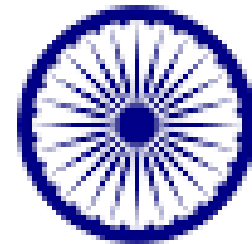
# Germany Harvest Festival
